Graduation Requirements: Students must earn 220 credits to graduate (five credits per semester for courses completed with a grade of "D" or better).

Credits must include: four years of English, two years of math, two years of science, three and a half years of social science, two years of physical education, one semester of health, and one year from two of the following: foreign language/technical/visual-performing arts. Up to 40 credits of non-district course work can be placed on transcript.

College Connect College Connect is a dual-enrollment opportunity for students to enroll in a shortened high school schedule so that they may attend college courses during their 11th and 12 grade years. College Connect students can complete up to 30 units of transferable credit aligned with the University of California's (UC) and California State University(CSU) Inter-segmental General Education Transfer Curriculum (IGETC) requirements. These students have the opportunity to complete their first year of college by the time that they graduate from high school.
