CAHSEE

The California High School Exit Exam (or CAHSEE) is a requirement for high school graduation in the state of California, created by the California Department of Education to improve the academic performance of California high school students, and especially of high school graduates, in the areas of reading, writing, and mathematics; public school students must pass the exam before they can receive a high school diploma, regardless of any other graduation requirements.

What are you tested on?

The CAHSEE is divided into two main sections: English-language arts (ELA) and mathematics. The English section includes 79 multiple choice questions, and requires students to respond to a prompt with a 2 1/2 page essay. The mathematics section consists of 92 multiple choice questions. Scores are scaled out of a possible 450 points on each section.

Impact on Special Education

- As of October 29, 2006, high school seniors with documented disabilities were allowed to graduate in that year, even if they did not pass the CAHSEE.
- As of 2008, students (reg. ed. / spec ed.) must pass the exam in order to receive a diploma. There is no longer in a waiver for special education
