Our volunteer groups donate thousands of hours and raise over \$1 million annually to facilitate student and school programs. Parent support is critical for maintaining our long tradition of educational excellence and strong community.

Academic Boosters

For over 20 years, Academic Boosters has been SRV's non-profit education fund committed to supporting programs that enhance the educational experience for ALL students at SRVHS. Run by volunteer parents, it is funded primarily by **parent donations** at registration and during the spring fundraising drive. Parent donations fund much needed additional class sections, thus reducing student-to-teacher ratios in core subjects, such as Math, Science, Social Sciences, English, and World Languages and allows for greater elective choices, such as AP, honors, music, visual and performing arts that **are not covered by state funding**.

We ask for an annual donation of **\$650 per student** and our **goal is 100% participation**. **Any donation amount is greatly appreciated**. Our annual budget is over \$500,000. Last year, over 85% of our annual budget funded **18 extra class sections** and the **College and Career Center**. **We focus our funding on adding in-demand courses to the master schedule** at an average cost of over \$25,000 per class section. Donations also fund **free after-school tutoring** labs taught by our teachers known as **Academic Support Labs**, peer tutoring, teacher **grants, student academic clubs, and scholarships**. These programs are essential to every student on campus and only happen as annual funding allows. Corporate matching is accepted and encouraged.

Athletic Boosters

Athletic Boosters is a parent-run organization dedicated to supporting the 24 athletic programs in both men's and women's sports at SRVHS so student-athletes at SRV can experience the lifelong benefits of participating in high school athletics. Every dollar raised subsidizes the funding necessary to provide quality athletic programs for the student-athletes at SRVHS at all levels: freshman, junior varsity, and varsity. A large portion of the funds raised go directly to the Athletic Dept Fund. In addition, every year the Athletic Booster organization contributes to each sport team directly based on the booster memberships on that team. We also work with each sport on fundraising events that benefit them directly. We provide scholarships and well-deserved athlete of the month recognition throughout the school year. We are a 501(c)(3) organization. Your donation is tax-deductible and qualifies for corporate matching.

In addition to free admission to all home regular season football and basketball games, booster members will have their own access to our new video camera system so you can stream games. You can also access away games where the away team has the same system. The cameras are installed in the Main Gym, Stadium Field, Pool, and Softball Field. (Baseball has an existing home camera). We will also be giving each member SRV lanyards and membership cards to identify you as an Athletic Booster.

As such, voluntary participation donations are accepted to fund these valuable programs. We encourage all interested students to try out for athletic teams. The voluntary donation covers major operating costs for each sport and our athletic department. This donation is used for: officials, equipment, coaching stipends, game management, first aid supplies, facility upgrades, CIF, NCS, EBAL fees and various general expenses to operate our athletics. 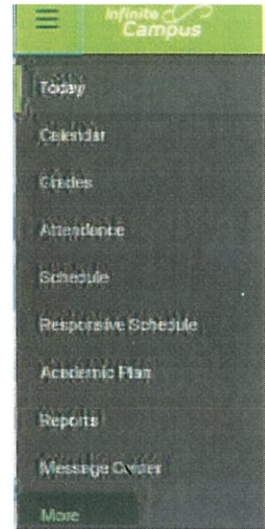
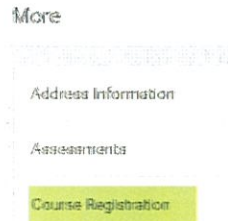

Students will use everyday tools and equipment to engineer models of some of their designs. This course also gives students the opportunity to hone their business skills. 1. Complete your personal information (PLEASE PRINT) in the space provided above. This form is a worksheet to select courses BEFORE you enter them into Infinite Campus. The online portal will be open on March 4–March 13. Please turn in your course selection form to your middle school counseling office by March 15th.
2. All 9th graders will automatically be placed in the following courses:
 - a. English 9
 - b. World Geography and Culture / Health
 - c. PE 9
 - d. Biology (Note: email your High School Counselor to opt out of Biology and cross it off the form. Be sure to select another course in its place.)
3. Please select courses on the back of this worksheet by marking an "X" in the box next to your first choice selections. An "X" has already been marked on required courses (as noted above).
 - a. You MUST choose an alternate for each elective class (Visual/Performing Arts, CTE). If you do not, your counselor may choose for you. Please choose an alternate course by marking an "A" in the appropriate box.
 - b. Consult with your current math teacher and select the appropriate math class (back of this worksheet).
4. Once you have completed this course selection form, please log onto Infinite Campus and choose your course selections (*see Infinite Campus Online Registration Instructions*). 5. Important: When choosing your class schedule please remember to submit your class choices with the appropriate "Unscheduled" periods. [For example, if you **do not** want a "1st" period class, you then must submit "**Unscheduled 1 (S1) Fall / (S2) Spring**"; if you **do not** want a "7th" period class, you then must submit "**Unscheduled 7 (S1) Fall / (S2) Spring**" along with your class choices]
6. Print the summary page for your personal records and make sure it matches this worksheet.
7. You will be turning in **THIS** course selection form to your middle school counseling office by March 15th. Please make sure boxes are properly marked and signatures are completed.
8. There is a section on the back of this form that asks questions regarding Personalized Learning Options. Check and complete any boxes/information that applies to you for the 2022-2023 school year.

Please consider, 9th grade is typically a big adjustment year for teens. New social environment, bigger school, harder classes, more expectations. Keep this in mind when selecting courses. It is important to challenge yourself, but remember to maintain balance and consider outside activities and responsibilities when choosing your classes.
