He was the first Freshman ever to play Junior Varsity football at San Ramon. He played running back and set The only reason he did not play Varsity is that league rules prohibited Freshmen from playing Varsity at that ti

He was a 4-Year letterman in Track and part of Bob Vincent's undefeated track teams 1964-67. Was undefea 4 years and his school records in Shot Put and Discus stood for nearly 40 years.

He was part of 440 and 880 relay teams whose school records stood until the 80's and these relay teams wor '67.

He was ranked in top-10 in the State of California in his Sophomore, Junior and Senior years for Shot Put and years.

He played Halfback on the undefeated league-champion 1966 San Ramon football team.

At 235 lbs., he could run the 100-yard dash in 9.8 seconds and could kick or throw a football 70 yards.

In the last game of the season, with San Ramon down 5 points and 2:30 left in the game, he threw a 60-yard preserve the team's undefeated championship season.

He received a Football scholarship to the University of California at Santa Barbara, where he played tailback.
